## **A. General part**

### **1. Course objectives**

The Histology and Embryology course is run over two semesters of the second academic year. During the third semester, the focus is on general and specialised histology. Histology will be presented from a functional point of view, with a particular emphasis on normal histology.

During the fourth semester the focus is on different areas of human development: developmental disorders associated with genetic conditions that lead to the most common syndromes, and the influence of different factors (genetic causes, environmental factors and teratogenic factors) on the development of the embryo (clinically oriented embryology). Important topics of functional histology for specific organs or organ systems will be discussed in detail during seminars.

Lectures and practical tutorials will be held in Slovenian, while medical terminology will include Latin terms.

### **2. Comprehensive outline of the course**

The course consists of **lectures, seminars, practical tutorials and colloquia.**

**Participation of students in all practical tutorials is mandatory.** In case of absence, an absence report must be provided.

Some practical tutorials will take place at the Institute of Histology and Embryology, other practical tutorials will employ e-learning platforms. Practical tutorials will take place according to the schedule; we will inform you about the method of implementation promptly via the online classroom. Practical tutorials at the Institute of Histology and Embryology will be conducted following the safety recommendations of the NIJZ.

Before the beginning of practical tutorials, each student must inspect both boxes with tissue slides that are on the desks. Any incident (if the tissue slide is missing or the microscope does not work properly) should be immediately reported to Assistant Technicians. Students will be charged for tissue slide or microscope damage caused by negligence according to the valid pricelist.

Students must come to practical tutorials prepared. A student who exhibits inappropriate behaviour may be required to leave the class. Such students are then required to make an appointment with one of the course faculty and show their knowledge of the topic discussed.

Beside mandatory practical tutorial, students will be able to attend elective practical tutorials as well. Elective practical tutorials (i.e. microscopy workshops) will be organized according to the timetable. The rules above also apply to elective microscopy workshops.

### **3. Description of on-going assessment of knowledge and skills**

Students will prepare seminars in the winter semester of the academic year 2020/2021. The topics and detailed instructions for preparation of seminars will be announced during the course lectures in October 2020. The maximum number of students per seminar group is four. All students in the group must be prepared for the seminar and be able to reply to questions asked. The ability of the student to answer the questions is a condition for the seminar to be completed. The seminar is evaluated with a pass/ did not pass.

**Two colloquia** will be held for dental medicine students. The attendance at both colloquia (mid-term exams held in the fourth semester) is mandatory. The written colloquium consists of 30 multiple-choice questions and up to 10 images of different tissue slides:

1<sup>st</sup> colloquium: general histology

2<sup>nd</sup> colloquium: special histology and embryology.

Successfully passed colloquia are mandatory before taking the final exam. A student passes the colloquia if he/she achieves a total of 36 points or more (60% or more). If he/she achieves 48 points or more (80% or more) in the colloquia, the student is exempted from taking the written exam. The student is exempted from taking the written exam only on the first taking of the final exam.

#### **4. Conditions for the final examination (Exam on the subject)**

In order to apply for the final examination (course exam) students must attend all practical tutorials, the oral presentations of selected seminar papers and both written colloquia.

Anyone who **fails to pass** written colloquia (achieves less than 36 points) must pass a **pre-exam colloquium** before the final exam. Anyone who fails to pass written colloquia or a pre-exam colloquium, cannot apply for the final exam.

#### **5. Final exam and examination of knowledge and skills (Course Exam)**

5.1. Exam tests include a theoretical part (30 multiple-choice questions) and visual material (recognizing 30 histological structures of organs and tissues). There are no negative points in the exam.

The student's final grade of the exam consists of the points achieved in the written part of the exam accordingly:

5.2 A student who passes the written exam (achieves 36 points or more) must also pass the oral exam. The student receives the final grade of the exam after taking the oral part of the exam.

5.3 Positive grade in the written exam is mandatory for taking the oral exam, except when the student did not pass the written exam (achieved 36 points or more) for the third time.

5.4 When a student is taking the final exam for the fourth or fifth time, the oral examination is conducted before the Examining Board.

5.5 Students register for the inspection of written colloquia/exams via e-mail ([ihe@mf.uni-lj.si](mailto:ihe@mf.uni-lj.si)) within seven days after the colloquium/exam. Registered students will be notified by e-

mail about the date of the visit. Written colloquia/exams are available for inspection only after the oral exams have been finalized.
