A. General part

1. Course objectives

OBJECTIVES

Objectives of the course are:

- to get students acquainted with the fields of work of all medical professions participating in an interdisciplinary course,
- to meet students with the complementarity of the specific competencies of a particular health profession,
- to enable students to plan interprofessional team work to solve specific health problems.

COMPETENCES

At the end of the module it is expected that students:

- know and understand the fields of work of all medical professions participating in an interdisciplinary course,
- know and understand the complementarity of the specific competencies of a particular health profession,
- is able to develop a plan of a team work to solve specific health problem.

2. Comprehensive outline of the course organisation

The course is taught in the form of lectures and seminars in a total of 90 contact hours:

- lectures (30 hours), on which important topics from the field of the course are presented; 70% participation is required,
- seminars (60 hours), in which seminar work is held, and students compulsorily produce a group seminar work in the group with other students, which is finally presented to other students in the course; presence is mandatory; the preparation and presentation of a seminar paper is mandatory.

In the case of an unfavourable COVID-19 epidemiological situation, lessons will be held remotely via the appropriate online platform.

3. Description of on-going assessment of knowledge and skills

As a process (on-going) assessment of knowledge, preparation and presentation of a group seminar work is considered. The score is made up of two parts. The preparation of the group seminar paper represents the first 50% of the rating, while the presentation of the topic in front of the auditorium is the remaining 50% of the rating. At the presentation, all teachers present, as well as interested students, raise oral questions. The number of questions could be different. A score that a student can obtain is:

4. Required conditions for the final examination (Course Exam)

The student can take the course final exam after the completion of organized forms of instruction, if he/she fulfills all the obligations prescribed by the study regime (70% attendance at lectures, full attendance at seminars and completed seminar work).

5. Final assessment and examination of knowledge and skills (Course Exam)

The process evaluation of knowledge (preparation and presentation of a group seminar work) is at the same time also a summative (final) evaluation of knowledge (course exam). The score is made up of two parts. The preparation of the group seminar paper represents the first 50% of the rating, while the presentation of the topic in front of the auditorium is the remaining 50% of the rating. At the presentation, all teachers present, as well as interested students, raise oral questions. The number of questions could be different. A score that a student can obtain is:
