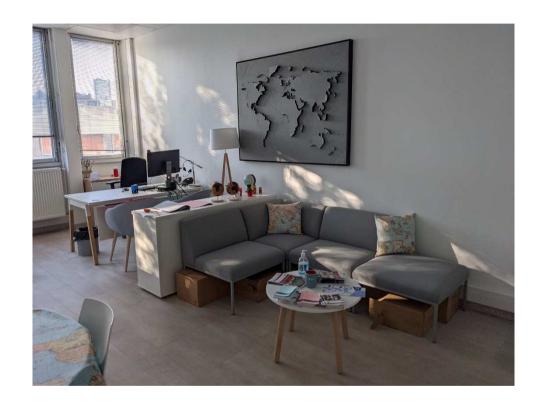


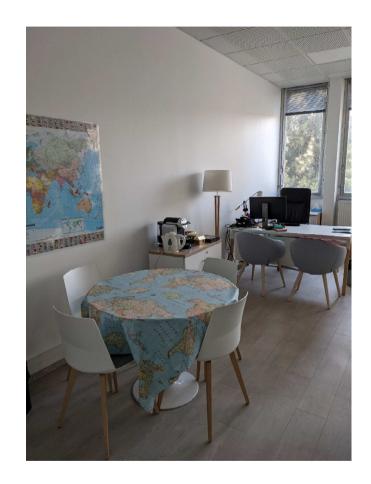

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How to find a hosting institution?

- → During trainings, for example EAIE
- → During staff weeks/conferences
- → Create a good atmosphere with your partner universities' colleagues, even if it is by e-mail/zoom...
- → Use your personal connections: as you work in an international environment, you may know someone who knows someone...



How to convince your management?

- → Job shadowing allows you to discuss the academic offer in detail, to see if a destination is really suitable for your students
- → Once you have a good communication with your partner and you know who does what, you could start deeper cooperation: joint conferences/virtual exchanges, teaching mobilities...
- → The whole operation could be paid by Erasmus+ budget
- → You will practice 1 or 2 foreign languages- useful in your every day work
- → Discovering other ways of working is always beneficial: you will come back with fresh ideas and it will give you energy to continue doing your best!



Practical organization

- \rightarrow 2, maximum 3 days
- → You could mix job shadowing in 1 institution with a meeting in another institution
- → Meet local students/your outgoing students
- → Meet as many people as you can. Even if they don't have the same position as yours.
- \rightarrow Take photos and notes
- ightarrow Ask questions but also share your experience
