A. General Part *(applies to compulsory and elective courses)*

1. Course objectives

The subject aims to improve the student's knowledge acquired at the Anatomy 2, with the emphasis on topography of the regions and their clinical importance. Curriculum comprises head and neck anatomy from the topographic and clinically-applicative perspective. It emphasises clinical importance of individual anatomical structures, their anatomical correlations with regard to other structures and applicable clinical cases. Students will have a chance to study anatomical cross-sections of different planes and correlate them to CT and MRI images.

2. Comprehensive outline of the course organisation

The subject consists of 6 hours of lectures and 9 hours of practical training in winter semester. Students have to be prepared for the practical training, by having sufficient theoretical knowledge. During practical course, they need to have protective clothing (gown, gloves), anatomical tweezers and study materials. Attendance is mandatory. Potential nonattendance is excusable only on account of official doctor's note or other official certificate. Substitution of practical course is able only in the same study week in agreement with practical course leader.

3. Description of on-going assessment of knowledge and skills

Student's knowledge will be tested continuously during the practical training by leader of the practical course. Attendance and cooperation during practical courses is required to successfully accomplish practical training.

4. Required conditions for the final examination (Course Exam)

Attendance at lectures and successful performance at practical training.

5. Final assessment and examination of knowledge and skills (Course Exam)

The course will end with final written exam (short essay questions and anatomical structures recognition on schemes of anatomical regions and cross sections). It is graded positive, if at least 60 % of points are achieved.

6. Other provisions

Other provisions on according to the Article 34 of the Regulation for assessment of knowledge and skills for the uniform master's study programme of medicine and dental medicine.

During writing the exam only pencil is allowed.
