A. General part (applies to compulsory and elective courses)

1. Course objectives

- part ENDODONTICS:

The student will get to know knowledge of biological and clinical principles and basic practical skills which are a prerequisite for endodontic treatment.

2. Comprehensive outline of the course organisation

- part ENDODONTICS:

Compulsatory part of the course Pre-clinical practicum. It lasts one semester, in the 6th semester of the uniform second-level Master's degree study of Dental Medicine.

• Lectures: 6th semester (first half), 2 hours lecture/week Students are advised to attend at least 70% of the lectures.

• Practical lessons: 6th semester, 3 hours/week

In the form of preclinical practical lessons. Attendance is mandatory.

Schedule of lectures and practical lessons is agreed with the enrolled students and published on the website.

3. Description of on-going assessment of knowledge and skills

- part ENDODONTICS:

Students are assessed continuously throughout their practical lessons. A written examination at the start (up to 3 essay type or 5 multiple-choice questions, exam duration 5 min) of each practical work, graded from 0 to 5 points. Each correctly answered question is awarded 1 point, there are no deductions for incorrect answers.

4. Required conditions for the final examination (Course Exam)

- part ENDODONTICS:

Successfully completed practical lessons are the condition for entering the final written part of the course exam.

5. Final assessment and examination of knowledge and skills (Course Exam)

- part ENDODONTICS:

• Written part of the exam (part endodontics) is performed as a combination of up to 30 essay type and multiple-choice questions. It takes up to 60 minutes. There are no deductions for incorrect answers.

- 5. In the Course Regime, the »Regulations for the Assessment of Knowledge and Skills for the Single-Cycle Master Study Programmes Medicine and Dental Medicine« will be referred to as "Regulations".
